Rabbi Aaron Krupnick **The Challenges of Pesach**

The story is told of a couple that lives in Eastern Europe at a time when the Czar decreed that everyone had to convert to Christianity. So the husband comes home to his wife and says, "I am sorry, my dearest, but there is nothing we can do, we must convert." But a week later the Czar dies, and the husband comes home and tells his wife, "I have wonderful news! We can go back to being Jewish." And his wife replies, "That's great, but could we wait until after Pesach!"

Pesach is challenging, it's not easy, especially if you are the one who is taxed with the majority of the cleaning, cooking and making sure everything is ready for the seder. Yet, we still look forward to the holiday, and to the sederim in particular, with great anticipation. But it's not simply the great food, nor just the opportunity to be together with family (or friends who have become like family). We also anticipate the wonderful conversations that come as a result of reading and discussing the Haggaddah around our tables.

The word "Haggaddah," like the word "Magid," (the section which tells the story and engenders the most conversation) comes from the three letter Hebrew root "Nun-Gimmel-Daled." (The Nun falls out in conjugation and gets replaced with a "Dagesh" – a dot in the Gimmel - for you Hebrew grammar fans.)

Interestingly, this three letter root means "opposite" or "opposition." To flesh out the story means to present it from a myriad of different viewpoints, some even in opposition to one another. The telling of the Haggaddah then is not something that is done passively, with one person talking or reading and the others just listening quietly without reacting. The Haggaddah is meant to be dynamic; it's meant to be a give and take, to be relational. The name of the pamphlet implies that we are supposed to entertain varied opinions and insight around the table in a way that shows our openness to one another's ways of looking at the world. With this in mind, is it any wonder that the Tradition emphasizes the Four

Children before opening the Magid section? Everyone brings his or her own perspective and life experience to the table. Come to the table expecting to be challenged, and anticipate responding with understanding and a willingness to learn.

If lively and thoughtful discussion is the goal (and not simply reading the printed page one after another around the table) then it makes sense that we prepare some good questions in advance. Here are four thought provoking questions that can be sent to participants in advance:

- We eat lots of bitter foods, particularly at the beginning of the seder. This reminds us that it is with a bitter taste in our mouths that we begin to tell the story of redemption. Can you think of an experience in your life when something started out as a "bitter pill to swallow," but turned out to be redemptive, ending on a sweeter note? How have the hardships of our lives made us into better people?
- Each section of the Haggaddah includes passages of gratitude. Is there someone in your past to whom you would like to express your gratitude? What would you say to that person?
- The plagues were designed to push the Egyptians, as well as the Jews, to reassess their mindset and change their outlook. Are there signs that you as an individual, and we, both as a People and a nation are refusing to see? What can we do, individually and collectively to understand the underlying messages of challenging times?
- What is the secret behind the mysterious survival of the Jewish people despite the fact that virtually every superpower in history has attempted to squash us? How can we use this self-understanding to help others find greater freedom and vitality?

Pesach is indeed a challenging time, intellectually and spiritually that is. But those challenges are what help us to grow in spirit and soul, to feel closer to one another and closer to our sacred heritage. I hope that your sederim are meaningful and informative and I wish you a Zissen Pesach, a Sweet and Happy Holiday.

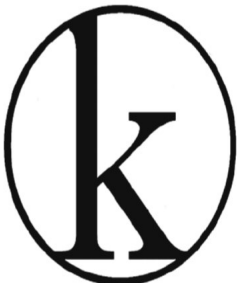

**Questions and Answers
by Rabbi Aaron Krupnick**

Q: When is the Fast of the First Born?

A: The *Siyum* of the Fast of the First Born will be held on **Friday morning, March 30 at 7:0 0AM**. We will conclude a *seder* (order) of Mishna at the end of services so as to negate the need to fast.

Q: When do we search for Chametz?

A: Following a thorough cleaning of the house, the search for leaven is held on **Thursday, March 29, after night fall**. Breadcrumbs are placed conspicuously in rooms where food is normally eaten. Using a candle, a search is made and the crumbs are whisked with a feather onto a wooden spoon and then into a paper bag. The prayer said at this time is found in the Haggadah.

**Q: What do we do with the crumbs in the bag?
Where is Chametz burned?**

A: Chametz should be burned on **Friday, March 30**. After morning Minyan (7:00AM), we will have a small bonfire in a steel drum in the parking lot to burn your Chametz. Parents and children can come between **8:15 AM and 9:00 AM** that morning to share in this ritual.

Q: How and why do I sell my Chametz?

A: On Pesach it is forbidden to possess Chametz.
B: All Chametz that will not be eaten or burned needs to be sold to a non-Jew through a transaction facilitated by the Rabbis of Beth El. (**Sale of Chametz form below.**) It should be returned or faxed (856)489-3280 to the Shul no later than **Wednesday, March 28** by 12PM.

Foods During Pesach

The following foods are forbidden for use during Pesach: All uncertified products of the 5 specified grains traditionally identified as Chametz: oats, wheat, barley, rye and spelt. This includes such products as bread, cakes, biscuits, crackers, cereal, etc. Ashkenazic custom has us refraining from eating rice, corn, peas and legumes because when ground they can be confused for those grains listed above. However, in a different form, some of the derivative products of these foods are permitted such as peanut oil. With so much *hechshered* food available in our area, it is best just to look for the certification on foods.

Kashering Utensils

Pots and Pans: Silverware and pots must be thoroughly scrubbed, cleaned and then completely immersed in boiling water. Pots should not be used for a period of at least 24 hours between the cleaning and the immersion in boiling water. Metal baking utensils cannot be kashered.

Earthenware: China and pottery etc. may not be kashered.

Ovens & Ranges: Every part that comes in contact with food must be thoroughly scrubbed and cleansed. Oven and range should be on as hot as possible for 1/2 hour.

Microwaves: After a thorough cleansing, a cup of hot water should be brought to a boil until most of the water disappears.

Dishwasher: The Rabbinical Assembly has ruled that after not using the machine for 24 hours, running a full cycle through empty with detergent will kasher a dishwasher for Pesach.

Tables, Food, Closets & Counters: Should be thoroughly cleaned and covered for Pesach. Then they may be used.

Kitchen Sink: A metal sink can be kashered by thoroughly cleaning and then pouring boiling water over it. A porcelain sink should be cleaned and a sink rack used. If, however, dishes are to be soaked in a porcelain sink, a dish basin must be used.

Rabbi Krupnick has full right to appoint any agent or substitute in his stead and said substitute shall have full right to sell and to lease as provided herein.

World War II and the Holocaust are the subjects of many recent novels. Events before, during, and after the War continue to engage readers. Here are three new novels that explore these topics:

The Prague Sonata by Bradford Morrow takes you on an adventure as Meta Taverner searches for a music manuscript. Meta might have had a brilliant career as a concert pianist, but an injury ended that possibility, and now she is a musicologist. She meets an elderly Czech immigrant in New York City and is given a piece of what seems to be an authentic 18th C. work, perhaps by a master. The Czech woman asks Meta to find the rest of the manuscript, which had been divided into three parts by its owner during WWII in an effort to prevent the entire work from falling into Nazi hands. Meta honors the request, and her search takes her to Prague, where not everyone who offers to help her has her best interests in mind. The novel combines WWII history, information about Prague, and details about music of the late 18th C. in a captivating story.

We Were Strangers Once by Betsy Carter starts with the story of Egon Schneider, a successful Jewish doctor in prewar Germany. When WWII causes him to leave the country he loves, he heads to America, settling in Washington Heights. Instead of practicing medicine, he is reduced to selling cheese in a local grocery store. His friend Meyer, also a refugee, was a bestselling author but is now earning a living wearing a sandwich board and traversing the same path daily on a New York City Sidewalk. Egon becomes friends with Catrina Harty, a poor Irish girl, and together, using his medical knowledge, they treat injured and sick animals. But unlicensed Egon faces dire consequences for his actions. This novel shows the often desperate circumstances of once-successful refugees struggling to eke out a living in their adopted country.

The Boat Runner by Devin Murphy is a debut novel about Jacob Koopman, a boy from a wealthy Dutch family. His father, seeking to profit from German business, sends Jacob to a Hitler Youth camp in Germany, where he is thoroughly indoctrinated. When the war breaks out, Jacob's uncle has him help in the "boat runner" anti-German

efforts that give the book its title. Then a devastating Royal Air Force raid on his town causes Jacob's loyalties to be tested. He joins the German army and ultimately faces a crucial moral dilemma. In an interview, the author said, "I wrote this book because I was fascinated by how Nazi Germany used controlled information, news, and propaganda to establish power, and how storytelling cut through all that into the truth of what really mattered." This book has received high praise for its strong writing and different approach to the horrors of Nazi Germany.

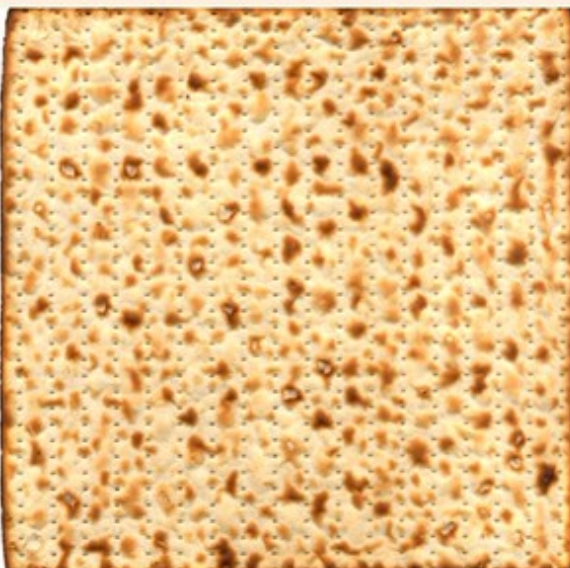
