Curriculum

Hebrew

In Hebrew class students will work on their decoding and reading skills and work on prayers for graduation and their upcoming B'nei Mitzvah.

Israel Connection

This is a curriculum that will connect the students to Israel while building Jewish values. Through multi-media presentations and textual sources, as well as **Face Time**, students will engage with the real Israel.

Chugim
